Rules:

1. The judges are in control of the competition and their decision is final.
2. The competition is oral. Pens, pencils or paper are not allowed.
3. Competitors are expected to sign in 15 minutes prior to the advertised time of competition. No competitor will be permitted to join the competition once spelling has commenced.
4. The competitor may ask the spell master to repeat a word and use it in a sentence. Also, if the Judges are unsure of the competitor's spelling, e.g. couldn't hear, the competitor may be asked to repeat the spelling.
5. The competition shall be conducted in rounds.
6. During the first round the student will introduce him/herself and tell what school they are from.
7. The first round is a PRACTICE ROUND, so no one is eliminated from that round.
8. If none of the competitors remaining in the Spelling Bee at the start of a round spells a word correctly during that round, all shall remain in the competition.
9. If only one of the competitors in the competition at the start of a round spells a word correctly during that round, a new round shall begin and the competitor shall be given the opportunity to spell the next word on the list. If the competitor succeeds in correctly spelling the new word, the competitor shall be declared the champion. Otherwise, all competitors remaining in the competition at the start of the previous round shall remain in the competition. A new round will begin with these competitors spelling in the original order.
10. The champion is not the champion until he/she has spelled correctly two more words than the speller placing second has spelled.

CLASS 33 ENGLISH SPELLING BEE

1. Three top Grade 5 and three top Grade 6 spellers from Sunderland and McCaskill's Mills Public Schools.
2. The official dictionary is the Oxford Canadian Dictionary.

CLASS 34 FRENCH SPELLING BEE

1. Six Grade 7/8 Core French Student spellers from Sunderland and McCaskill's Mills Public Schools
2. Students spell French vocabulary in English

Additional Rules and Notes:

1. Any boy or girl who is a resident or is attending school in the Township of Brock may exhibit one entry in each section where she or he is qualified.
2. No entry fee shall be charged.
3. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. All entries must be new work since Fair Day, 2010.
5. All entries in writing and creative writing must be completed and submitted by June 27, 2011 and all other entries may be taken to the Arena between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Monday, September 12, 2011 and Tuesday, September 13, 2011 before 11:00 a.m.
6. All entries must remain on display until 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 14, 2011. The arena will be locked for the night at 9:30 p.m. Entries may also be picked up between 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 15, 2011.
7. The Fair Board will not be responsible for any entries not picked up by 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 15, 2011.
8. All entries at owner's risk but will be protected as far as possible by Fair Management.
9. The following information is to appear on each entry: pupil's name, grade, school and teacher's name. (On the BACK of the entry)

SCHOOL DISPLAY: \$10.00 will be given to each school exhibiting an attractive display of daily school work including art, posters, crafts, projects, etc. and an attractive poster 12" by 18" or 30 cm by 46 cm made by the students to identify your school. This display is to include sufficient work from all grades to cover a table space approximately 8' by 4' including wall space behind. Displays are to be arranged by teachers and helpers by 3:00 p.m. Monday, September 12, 2011. Displays are non-competitive.
